

Tameside College Delivers with Dignity in the Health and Social Development Department

Tameside College's Health and Social Development Department have successfully completed the Dignity Training Module, which forms a part of the Daisy Accreditation.

The Health and Social Development Department are taking part in the Daisy Accreditation delivered by Tameside and Glossop Community Healthcare Business Group.

The first module of the accreditation is to undertake a training day where Health and Social staff discussed dignity within health and social care as well as the workplace. The team looked at compiling evidence, engaging with service users and challenging poor practice. The team will now set about completing their workbook and fulfilling their new roles as Dignity Champions.



During the day the team have developed a Dignity Mission Statement for the Department which will be displayed within the College. This will set out the Department's expectations of Dignity for staff, students and members of the public.

The training will be delivered to students of the Health and Social Development Department to ensure that the principles of Dignity in Care are embedded across the whole department.

The Daisy Accreditation is being delivered to a variety of health and social care organisations, including a variety of care homes, clinics, in-patient units and sheltered accommodation across Tameside and Glossop. This will provide an advantage to students entering these environments if they are already aware and working under the Daisy Accreditation.
